

"Hit the Target" Toolkits for 3 High Priority Objectives

Working groups are creating "Hit the Target" Toolkits for the following CSHP 2015 objectives:

- 1.3 In 90% of hospitals, pharmacists manage medication therapy for inpatients with complex and high-risk medication regimens in collaboration with other members of the healthcare team.
- 3.1 In 100% of hospitals and related healthcare settings, pharmacists will be actively involved in providing care to individual patients that is based on evidence, such as the use of quality drug information resources, published clinical studies or guidelines, and expert consensus advice.
- 4.7 75% of pharmacies in hospitals utilize a unit-dose system for drug distribution for 90% or more of their total beds.

National Delegate's Report

The Society and Council have been busy over the summer months. On August 7 – 10th, 2010, the Society held its Summer Educational Sessions (SES) in Halifax, Nova Scotia. The Education Services Committee developed an excellent and interesting educational program. The August 2011 SES is being held in Vancouver, and the SES Host Committee is working to ensure an exciting time for all. I would like to extend an invitation to this event.

National Council Meeting Update

At the start of the SES conference, the national council met and the following are a few of the high-lights:

- Development of a draft strategic business plan (2011 2014). This draft will be circulated to the branches for comments and feedback. CSHP Council will review the input from the branches and vote on the final plan at the 2011 Midterm Council meetings in March
- A CSHP Pharmacy Technician Task Force will be struck to review the implications of creating a pharmacy technician specific membership category and suggest potential membership benefits that could be promoted to pharmacy technicians.
- A task force has been struck to develop guidelines for the solicitation of funds for educational events.

Finances

The 2009 -2010 fiscal year ended with a deficit of \$41,822. This figure was less than the \$111,450 deficit which was budgeted for. The financial situation is such that the Society is still able to maintain its established reserve fund target of six months operating expenses.

Advocacy

CSHP has been front and centre in two recent articles in the national media. Executive Director Myrella Roy and President Neil MacKinnon provided a hospital pharmacy perspective to an article in Macleans magazine related to E-Health drug records and an article in the National Post on the design of drug packaging and its role in medication errors.

1. CSHP FUTURE PROFESSIONAL PHARMACY STUDENT AWARD

AWARD DESCRIPTION The award will consist of admission to the CSHP Banff Conference, \$500 to offset expenses associated with attending the Banff Conference, and individual plaque and an ongoing plaque at the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Science at University of British Columbia. This award will be given to a member of CSHP-BC Branch who has shown significant and extensive contribution to promoting and exhibiting professionalism in any variety of pharmacy related activities at the local, provincial or national level. The candidate must be an active member of CSHP-BC Branch.

APPLICATION DEADLINE Nominations shall be submitted to bccshpaward@gmail.com no later than **November 30**

2. CSHP Pharmacy Practice Award

AWARD DESCRIPTION The award will consist of a plaque engraved with all investigators" names and a cash prize of \$250. The poster presenter must be a CSHP member, and can either be the primary investigator or one of the authors of the poster. Posters must be submitted under one category entitled "Pharmacy Practice". This encompasses clinical research, pharmaceutics/ basic research, case reports, innovative pharmacy practice, administrative topics, pharmacoeconomics and drug use evaluation. Material previously presented at a national CSHP or non-CSHP event is eligible for submission. In this case, please indicate that it is an encore presentation on the poster/abstract. Material previously presented at a BC Branch CSHP event (i.e., residency project) is not eligible for submission.

Mentorship Program 2010-2011 Call for Mentors

Another academic year is over! With 52 student members and over 20 registered mentors last year, thanks to you, the mentorship program was a huge success! The success of the program has encouraged even more students to participate this year.

One of the main benefits of a student membership is the Mentorship program. This program is designed to increase student awareness about hospital pharmacy. This includes the many roles of the clinical pharmacist, the pharmacy technician, the medication distribution system, clinical researchers, and pharmacy administrators. This is achieved by pairing UBC pharmacy students with pharmacist mentors who together arrange subsequent hospital visitations based on their mutually agreed upon schedules. As part of the program, students are given the opportunity to shadow their mentor to gain a better understanding of the daily activities of the mentor. The scheduled sessions typically range from half a day to a week of contact over the course of the year (depending on the learning objectives of the student and the availability of the mentor). Suggested activities and goals are outlined with respect to the student's academic pharmacy year.

Growing student interest in hospital pharmacy, together with an influx of students in September, necessitate more mentors. With your help and support, we can continue to grow our mentorship program and make it better than it has ever been before. Your assistance will not only help our future pharmacists, but will also help to promote hospital pharmacy within the student body.

If you are a hospital pharmacist and are willing to act as a mentor, we need you! We welcome pharmacists who are involved in distribution services, clinical services, specialized clinical areas, drug utilization evaluation, administration, and other facets of hospital pharmacy.
