

September is always a busy time at UBC and this year has been no exception. With the entrance of this year's 224 first year students the Faculty of Pharmacy has now reached full capacity, at approximately 900 undergraduate students. We are now fully settled into our beautiful new building and are proud to house the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences Pharmacists Clinic, Canada's first university-affiliated, licensed, pharmacist-led clinic. Accompanying this increased enrollment is an ever increasing interest in hospital pharmacy amongst students. This is evidenced by our expanding number of CSHP Student Supporters and increased interest in CSHP events. Well over 200 pharmacy students visited the CSHP booth at Pharmacy Club's Night and we had a full lecture hall of students come and listen to Dr. Karen Dahri and Dr. Mike Legal speak about the amazing opportunities that exist in hospital pharmacy practice at this year's CSHP Membership Information Session. We would also like to give a special thank you to the BC Cancer Agency for once again hosting an open house and information night for interested UBC Pharmacy students. Looking forward, we will be promoting hospital pharmacy to students at the upcoming UBC Pharmacy Careers Avenue evening and are excited about the joint CSHP-CAPSI Clinical Symposium to be held in November. In the near-term we will be working hard increase student awareness and involvement by promoting CSHP and CSHP events through social media via Facebook and Twitter.

The CSHP Mentorship Program continues to be an extremely popular and valuable opportunity for Student Supporters. For those unfamiliar, the Mentorship Program pairs pharmacy students with a practicing hospital pharmacist mentor. Through this pairing, students are given the opportunity to shadow their mentor and gain a better understanding of the role of the hospital pharmacist. The shadowing sessions can provide a general overview of hospital pharmacy practice, or provide a more detailed look at the mentor's daily activities in a specialized setting. We encourage each mentor and mentee to discuss and plan individualized learning outcomes. Students who complete the Mentorship Program repeatedly provide positive feedback about their experiences. The unique opportunity provided by the Mentorship Program is especially important because of the minimal exposure to hospital pharmacy that students receive throughout their undergraduate pharmacy education. Students felt that the experience and knowledge gained by participating in the Mentorship Program strongly influenced their future career plans and opened up additional opportunities created through the relationships they formed with their mentors.



National Advocacy



This will be my last opportunity to address you as BC's representative to CSHP's National Advocacy Committee (NAC). A lot can happen (and has) in four short years.

Pharmacist advocacy is in a time of transition. Four years ago, CSHP's "advocacy" consisted of letter writing to a number of government officials across Canada, to health authority senior staff, to other national organizations, such as Canadian Medical Association and the Canadian Nurses Association, and providing responses on controversial issues when asked. While the goal of the letter writing was to raise awareness of the benefits and roles of hospital pharmacists, the effectiveness of this strategy was often questioned, as it relied on others to read these letters, buy into the message, and take action on our behalf.

In my second year on the NAC, I had the fortune of being appointed Senior Chair. Simultaneously, the BC government announced its intent to abolish the market adjustment for hospital pharmacists, which would have substantially undermined the compensation for hospital pharmacists by about 8-13%. Ironically, this turn of events ignited the transition of the national advocacy strategy from "passive and polite" to "active and assertive"... much beyond the traditional comfort zone of your everyday pharmacist.

Through the NAC, BC was able to access a media relations consultant, who kindly re-focused his services to help us strategize a media counter-campaign, and develop key messages - messages which are integral in our 2 minute hospital pharmacist video clip. Together with Branch President Shirin Abadi and National President Janice Munroe, we secured a meeting with the Minister of Health at the time, the Honorable Mike de Jong, in March 2012. Through thorough research, preparation, and key messaging, the meeting proved highly successful, and we learned valuable lessons about how to conduct advocacy campaigns. And because the market adjustment scare affected all hospital pharmacists, it was interesting and inspiring to see so many hospital pharmacists getting together to have their voices heard. This was so unlike hospital pharmacists of old, who as a group were usually quite invisible, silent, and divisive on issues. The market adjustment campaign showed that hospital pharmacists can be a force if need be, and moving forward, we will need to be.

We learned that we don't get unless we ask, and that when we ask, we need to be noticeable, prepared, convincing, and offer well thought out solutions. We need to support our organization (i.e. CSHP), as governments are often interested in the sheer numbers that we represent

(i.e. potential voters and/or influencers). And we need to be active. Don't rely on the same individuals to do the same work year-after-year. Get involved, help out, and take over.

Yes, take over.... Did I mention that this is my final year? I thank the CSHP-BC Council and CSHP National for providing me with an opportunity to do my part to help move the profession forward. I have been inspired by the energy of the people I've met and worked with, the media campaigns we've launched, the in-roads that we've made with government, and the trajectory of advocacy that hospital pharmacists have embraced.

A lot has happened in the past four years. Can you imagine how far we will go in the next four years?


